## Student Conduct Covenant

I \_\_\_\_\_ covenant with the Libertas Christian School Community to hold myself to the following standards of conduct:

- I understand that a purpose of Libertas Christian School is to encourage and assist me to live as a follower of Jesus Christ in all areas of life. Therefore, I will respect and honor the school's role in my life.
- I will be faithful in attendance and will be prepared to learn whenever Libertas is in session.
- I understand that being a Libertas student in good standing requires that my attitude, speech, behavior and dress promote Christian community and honor Jesus Christ as Lord.
- I will keep myself in good standing with Libertas and strive to meet and exceed Libertas standards for behavior and education.

### Libertas Student Etiquette Standards

*Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Each of you should not look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others." Phil. 2:3-4*

There are numerous ways that students are encouraged and expected to show kindness to one another and their teachers. Periodically, students will receive instruction and reminders about these expectations. It is our hope that these actions will become part of the daily routine at Libertas.

We expect our young men to show consideration and respect for the ladies in the school. We want to train our young ladies to graciously accept the sacrifice of the young men. We want the young men to:

1. Opening doors for all ladies – whether parents, teachers, or students. Always allow the ladies to exit the room (or the bus) first. Further, if a young lady arrives at school with an armload of books, offer to assist.
2. In the hallways, men are chivalrous and defer to the ladies by giving them space and avoid running into them.

3. In all events where food served, allowing women are to be served and seated first.

We want to train our students to show proper respect to their teachers and administrators.

1. Students should address their teachers by Mr., Miss, or Mrs.
2. Students should respond by saying “yes” or “no”, not “yeah” or “ugh”. (“Sir” and “Ma’am” are recommended.)

Conclusion: We would like Libertas to be a place where visitors sense a difference. Specifically, the aroma of Christian love. *(“But thanks be to God, who always leads us in triumphal procession in Christ and through us spreads everywhere for fragrance of the knowledge of Him. For we are to God the aroma of Christ among those who are being saved and those who are perishing. To the one we are the smell of death, to the other, the fragrance of life.” II Corinthians 2:14–15)*

### Boy–Girl Relationship Standards

Libertas desires to promote wholesome, Christ–honoring relationships between our students that will not be spiritually, academically or socially distracting. Libertas students shall present themselves in a manner so as not to cause embarrassment to themselves or other people around them. Libertas adheres to a total “hands off” policy for all students. A public display of affection during the school day, on campus or at any school event will not be allowed. Persistent problems will result in a conference with the Administrator, students, and parents.
